- 1) General Surgery rotations include many of the essential content areas such as the abdomen and its contents; the alimentary tract; skin, soft tissues, and breast; endocrine surgery; and head and neck surgery.
- 2) Dedicated rotations are provided in Pediatric Surgery, Cardiothoracic Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Trauma and Non-operative Trauma (will include burn experience), Vascular Surgery, Colorectal/Minimally Invasive Surgery (will include upper and lower endoscopy), ENT (head/neck), and Plastic Surgery
- 3) Surgical oncology rotations will include a broad range of essential content areas, similar to general surgery, with the only difference being the oncology component.
- 4) Plastic Surgery will include essential content areas such as skin and soft tissue.
- 5) Vacation will not be considered during rotations in transplant, nightfloat or critical care (nights). The services are otherwise structured to allow for coverage of residents taking a vacation 1 week at a time.
- 6) Elective Options: Trauma, Critical Care, Burns and Wound Care, General Surgery, Pediatric Surgery, Cardiothoracic Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Vascular Surgery, Colorectal/Minimally Invasive Surgery, and Plastic Surgery
- 7) Each month is approximately four weeks long in duration
